As the holidays approach, my mind begins to turn toward books, as I anticipate some relaxing days to read after Christmas. I suspect I'm not the only one. Guessing that you might have a few moments to pick up a new book in the weeks to come, or might be looking to buy one as a gift for a relative or friend, I offer these recommendations.

For an Advent devotional, give Ruth Boling's *Season's Greetings: Christmas Letters from Those Who Were There* a try. In the book, Ruth imagines different characters in the Christmas story and writes letters from their perspective about what Christmas means to them. She's done plenty of research, so we learn a lot about what the first Christmas would have been like. But, more importantly, these letters invite us into the most important question of all: What does Christmas mean for us? Before the book was published, I read the manuscript in order to write an endorsement. Here's what I wrote: "It's been a very long time since I have read a book that has so moved me with the full wonder and beauty, challenge and

...thinks they don't like poetry. Some poets major in the obscure, but Collins is ever down to earth, finding joy and mystery in the mundane. Collins is a former U.S. Poet Laureate, and the New York Times called him the "most companionable of poetic companions." The poems in this volume often begin in the every day—at the breakfast table, watching a snowflake fall—but they end in surprise laced with gentle humor.

Anyone who reads children's literature knows of Kate DiCamillo, one of the most celebrated living writers of middle-grade fiction. Her newest novel, *Ferris*, follows a fourth-grade girl as she grapples with the wackiness of her domestic life: a grandmother recently diagnosed with congestive heart failure and who sees a ghost; an uncle who has moved into the basement to paint a history of the world; a six-year-old sister who is determined to become a bank robber. This is a story of friendship, family, and love, and the grand feast at the end, with more guests than anyone would have imagined, reminded me of a raucous Holy Communion at which everyone is welcome.

Finally, a short work of fiction that was published in 2021: *Small Things Like These*, by Claire Keegan. At 115 pages, this book falls somewhere between short story and novella, and can be read in one sitting. Keegan, an Irish writer, takes us into the heart and mind of Bill Furlong, a middle-aged father and husband who, at Christmas, is wondering about the meaning of his life. The story presents him with an opportunity to act with courage to do the right thing, even though it may have costs. At one point, walking through the town, Furlong "found himself asking was there any point in being alive without helping one another? Was it possible to carry on along through all the years, the decades, through an entire life, without once being brave enough to go against what was there and yet call yourself a Christian, and face yourself in the mirror?" The copy of the book I read last weekend was loaned to me, but it will land on my Christmas wish list, as I expect to reread it this time every year.

I pray that, as we move toward the celebration of Christmas, wherever and whatever you read, you find words that turn your heart to the wonder and beauty—as well as the heartbreak—of this world, stories that open your spirit to a deeper recognition of love.




