Where do you sense God's leading to help make our congregation a place where every person can be invited into a life of faith, experience growth in discipleship, and be prepared to use their gifts to participate in God's work in our congregation and in the larger world?

And in what ways do you feel God's strong leading to join with others in our church family to fight for justice, bring compassion to individuals and communities that need healing, and serve the suffering in ways that bring transformation to lives and our world?

Take the time you need after this difficult election season to care for yourself and check in with others. And when you are ready, ask God to guide you in answering the question, "What's next?" Then come and talk to me about how we can pray and work together to help our church be the community of love and peace, transformation and hope, that God is calling us to be.
