A Letter from Ginger Thomas, Co-Senior Pastor

Dear friends,

"The church has taken such good care of us!" a church member said to me with an embrace just after a family member's memorial service. As a pastor, it's reassuring to hear that congregation members like this feel cared for in some of their most difficult times.

The care that our church offers takes many forms—a meal delivered, a prayer shawl given, a pastor praying, a Stephen Minister's visit, blessing bags delivered, or a letter of concern mailed, to name a few. And our Minister of Congregational Care, Nikki Rosswog, is working to expand our congregational care ministries even more.

In 2021, Nikki was a church member whose heart of compassion led her to apply for a church position that would focus on visiting those who needed care a couple days a week. Since then, Nikki's love and faith have been a blessing as she has built relationships with those in our congregation who are ill, aging, grieving, lonely, or facing other challenges in their lives.

Nikki has also been expanding the reach of our church's congregational care ministries beyond the one-on-one visits she makes. She meets with a group every month at a local retirement home for Caring Conversations that brings faith and connection to residents associated with FCPC and others who are forming a relationship with our church through this caring outreach. Nikki has started a monthly Caregiver Coffeehour at the church to provide connection and support for those who are caregivers to family members, both for church members and community members. And this fall, Nikki trained and equipped congregation members to lead a 13-week experience of GriefShare, inviting grieving church and community members to come together for support and care in a loving, faith-based setting. ... In the past twelve months, Nikki has also been looking to expand the caring ministries of the church by equipping church members who have compassion to share. She has been actively attentive to identifying congregation members who have passion about caring for others and cultivating ways for them to be equipped, supported, and trained to offer care and love on behalf of the church. She has started to equip some church members to make visits to those who need care and has also begun to meet with a team to think together about strategically expanding the church's care to others. In recognition of this more expansive work she is doing to equip the church for the work of congregational care, her hours have been expanded and title changed from Minister of Visitation to Minister of Congregational Care.

In his letter to the Romans, Paul writes to the church an exhortation to use their God-given gifts to lovingly serve and care for others.

"As in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness. Let love be genuine...love one another with mutual affection...serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers... Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly." (Romans 12: 4-16)

If you have love to share with others, that is a gift that God has given you that can be a blessing to many in our congregation and community. Find time to connect with Nikki so that you can be a part of the love and care that our church is extending to others who really need it. Whether you want to join in one of the congregational care ministries already in place or have an idea for a new way our church can provide love, care, or connection, Nikki can help you find ways to use your gift of compassion to be a blessing to others.


