Dear friends,

Next Sunday, December 1, begins the season of Advent. The word "Advent" comes from the Latin adventus, meaning "coming" or "arrival." It refers to the anticipation of both the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas and the eventual Second Coming of Christ. It is also the start of our Christian year. This particular overlap of the Christian and worldly calendars has always been an interesting intersection to me. Our Christian calendar begins right at the world calendar's end. For those who don't really think about the Christian calendar, Christmas can be seen as the kickoff celebration to the final week of the year, the last big hoorah before beginning again on January 1.

But it isn't. It isn't the gateway to the end. It is the birthplace of our year's faith journey. In some ways, it is counterintuitive and countercultural. Given how our ancestors interpolated Christian beliefs within other religion's holy days and symbols, shouldn't we have changed things a long time ago to neatly lock our calendars in together?

But we don't have to. In fact, let's not. Let's make sure that in this last month of the calendar year, we don't conform. This year, I encourage you to really focus on Advent as a new beginning. Wake up! Shake off the world's understanding of December. Instead, breathe in the radical story about our all-powerful God doing the unpredictable by becoming a fragile mortal child. See anew the pictures of this God-man who touched people's rotting sores, whipped tables on their sides, and unabashedly contradicted the revered know-it-all. Then begin to imagine and wonder and plan for how you will move in the world because this is the God you follow. Does it feel different than before? Good. Is it uncomfortable? Even better. From my understanding of Christ's life, you are in good company. Happy Advent!
