Dear Friends,

I wasn't a great athlete as a child. I was slow, a little chubby. So when I played on my elementary school basketball team, I wasn't exactly the star of the team, to say the least. Mr. Kramer, my fourthgrade teacher, coached the team. He was a stern taskmaster, barking orders at us from the sideline. My greatest fear was getting the ball because I was never sure what to do with it. When someone threw me the ball—which was, admittedly, rare—I passed it on as quickly as possible. I didn't want to screw up and become the focus of the coach's wrath.

But that doesn't mean I didn't like to shoot baskets. When I was a freshman in high school, we had a basketball goal installed next to the driveway. I spent a lot of time alone tossing the ball at the hoop, and I got pretty good at it. It was an introvert's ideal situation. I didn't have to worry about someone firing the ball in my direction when I wasn't ready. I didn't have to fear a giant hand blocking a shot. Just the other night, some college-aged friends texted my son Silas to see if he could join them at the gym so they could play three-on-three—there were five of them, and they needed a sixth. When he got home, Silas said that one of the five hadn't shown, so they'd invited a stranger at the gym to play. "Why didn't you call me? I would have come," I said. He just laughed. He knows: I'm not cut out for team ball.

Being church is a team sport. There are no lone-ranger Christians. From the beginning, Jesus called a group of disciples (who missed a lot of shots, by the way). When you read Paul's letters, he's constantly referencing his colleagues and friends in ministry: I couldn't do this without them, he's always saying. When you read the book of Acts, the emphasis consistently falls on the church as a new community following the way of Jesus in the world. Yes, there are things we do alone—silence, solitude, prayer, spiritual disciplines, some forms of service. But given our union with each other through Christ, even those solitary pursuits of faith are part of a larger whole.

As we begin this new year together at FCPC, we are going to spend three weeks in January considering what it means for the church to be a team where everyone belongs and has a role to play as we move toward the goal-line Jesus has set for us. Along the way, there will be opportunity for each of us to respond by exploring our spiritual gifts, naming our passions for service, or expressing interest to serve in a particular area of the church's ministry. My prayer is that we will take this time at the beginning of the year to hear how God is inviting us to claim our part as an essential member of Team Jesus, and how being on the team finds tangible expression through participation in ministry at FCPC.

Paul in his letters doesn't use the image of a team. He uses the language of a body with its many parts, but the point is the same: we are in this together. As he says in the letter to the Ephesians, God has given the church leaders—pastors, preacher, evangelists, etc.—whose role is to equip the whole body (that's all of us!) for the work of ministry, so that we can all "grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love" (Eph. 4:15-16).

In other words, it's a team thing.



9:30 & 11 AM COMFORT SPACE


