A Letter from Ginger Thomas, Co-Senior Pastor

Dear friends,

In this season of preparation for Christmas, I'm thinking about the busy innkeeper who appears in Christmas pageants and children's storybooks that tell of Jesus' birth. We can picture him being confronted by a haggard Mary and Joseph, his shoulders shrugging as he apologizes for having no place for them but a barn, even though the familiar Christmas account of Jesus' birth in the gospel of Luke makes mention of an inn but no innkeeper.

Joseph and Mary were among scores of others in Bethlehem that night, so it's no surprise that there would not have been an available guest room for Joseph and Mary. We can imagine Joseph's frustration, wanting to provide for Mary, to give her a safe and comfortable place to rest from their journey. And we can just see the innkeeper, distracted by all the out-of-towners and the hectic day he had had. Who knows how many others he had turned away already before Joseph and Mary turn up. Maybe it was in the way that Joseph pleaded with him, that he thought of the barn. Maybe it was Mary's groaning, labor pains having already begun. Maybe it was the innkeeper's wife, who had pity on this poor young couple who needed a place to welcome a baby into the world.

Whatever it was that tugged at his heart, he offered what he had, a barn, to Mary and Joseph, and it was there that the light of the world came and shown in the darkness.

The innkeeper could never have guessed before this night that God's plan would unfold right under his nose. But in his little corner of Bethlehem, in the wee hours of night, a baby was born whose name was Emmanuel—God with us. ...CONTINUE PG. 2

...My friend Cathie, while shopping in a small store, started talking with the salesclerk. Her heart broke open as she learned that the salesclerk's father at that very hour was having surgery for cancer. "Let's pray," she said to the clerk. So they did. And afterward the clerk looked at her with tears in her eyes, saying no one had ever offered to pray for her before. That is light, shining in the darkness, in a place as unexpected as a barn in Bethlehem.

In Martin Luther's Christmas sermon from 1542, he says, "The inn was full... There are many of you who think to yourselves: 'If only I had been there! How quick I would have been to help the baby!' Why don't you do it now?" he continues. "You have Christ in your neighbor. You ought to serve your neighbor, for what you do to your neighbor in need, you do to the Lord Christ himself."

Sometimes our faithful, quiet obedience, without fanfare, is what God uses to bring about hope, healing, and light in our darkened world. When we as disciples go about doing our work quietly, doing our part to be faithful, who knows how God will shine light into the dark, unexpected places of our world! A kind gesture, a caring word, an act of forgiveness, an offer of help, a loving presence--these all can represent the light of Christ shining in the darkness for those wondering if God has any hope or light to offer them.

May all that we do, living in the light of Jesus Christ, be a reflection of his light, so that in our small acts of faithfulness, we and others will see Jesus, the Light of the world, shining in the darkness. O come, O come Emmanuel!

Congregational Meeting

A congregational meeting will be held on Sunday, January 5, at 10:40am in the Sanctuary, to form an Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC). Our current designated associate pastor, Rev. Rebecca DePoe, is serving our church for a designated time period that ends in September. The Session has approved a new job description for a future associate pastor and the Nominating Committee is prepared to nominate the following individuals to serve on the APNC to search for and identify a new associate pastor: Judy Grune, Mark Haas, Judy Leininger, Lynn Leppert, Jimmy Minor, Tim Oberlin, and Jaye Tupponce. The congregational meeting will have two agenda items: to receive nominations and officially elect members to the APNC, and to elect one individual to session for 2025 alone to a recently vacated position. The Nominating committee will be nominating Amy Szlachetka for this position.

Stewardship Update & Financial Info

As pledges continue to come in to financially support the church's ministries in 2025, we are excited to share that 19 new households have made pledges totaling more than \$99,000, and 69 households have increased their annual pledge amount



by a total of more than \$67,800. It's exciting that so many are investing in significant new ways as our church is "Following Jesus to Flourishing Ministry" in 2025. If you have submitted a pledge, thank you!

We have a good deal of progress still to make in funding the ministries we all count on and hope for in the coming year. Our pledges received for 2025 total \$42,000 less than the pledges made for the current year. Our ministry commitments are dependent on every person's giving. If you have not yet made a commitment, we hope you will prayerfully consider how you will be a part of supporting our church's ministries financially in the coming year. Per Capita

You can help offset FCPC's Per Capita assessment, paid to the presbytery based on church membership. This year our church will pay \$35,061, which represents \$38.11 per member. Your donation of \$38.11 can help offset this obligation. So far this year, \$2,045.70 has been donated to help cover FCPC's Per Capita amount.

2024 Reimbursements Due!

The deadline to request reimbursement for expenses incurred in 2024 is Tuesday, January 7th, 2025. You must submit a completed expense request with approval signature by this date. You can obtain expense request forms in the church office. If you are not sure how to fill out the form, please ask your committee chairperson to help you.

All 2024 pledge contributions, 2025 pledge prepayments or 2024 non-pledge contributions to FCPC must follow the deadlines below to be eligible for a 2024 tax deduction:


- Credit card donations must be made by midnight on December 31 in your time zone (your credit card statement must be time-stamped with a 2024 date).
